## Meeting Recap

- Group reached formal consensus to start with OPEN Demography
- Group started reviewing the OPEN Demography content and attributes
- Members asked if the coded values on the 4 dictionary questions on Demography form can change?
  - If they can change, what is the internal impact to your processes and how would you change them?

## **Content Review Strategy**

- Review the OPEN elements and their attributes
  - Use of numeric or other codes for Permissible value sets 5/26
  - Formats (dates)
  - Acceptable alternate question text and meanings No
  - Clarity of definitions
  - Scientific and research need
  - Concise value meanings
  - Naming conventions/special characters
  - Data types and field lengths
  - External Standards
  - Rave Integrations

## Examples

- Gender
  - In OPEN
    - Female Gender
    - Male Gender
    - Unknown
  - CDUS Coded Values
    - 1 Male
    - 2 Female
    - 9 Unknown

#### Matrix

- caAERS
  - List of reference CDEs and how it is being collected in the application
  - 16 Forms (potentially 15)
- OPEN (Ginger to provide 5.1)
  - 5 Forms
- CDUS
  - Complete
- CDISC
  - Include the elements that match the ones we have on the matrix from the other integrations
- Site Audit Report
  - 4 Fields

  - In OPFN
    - MEDICAID
    - MEDICAID AND MEDICARE
    - MEDICARE
    - MEDICARE AND PRIVATE INSURANCE
    - MILITARY OR VETERANS SPONSORED NOS
    - MILITARY SPONSORED (INCLUDING CHAMPUS &TRICARE)
    - NO MEANS OF PAYMENT (NO INSURANCE)
    - OTHER
    - PRIVATE INSURANCE
    - SELF PAY (NO INSURANCE)
    - Unknown
    - VETERANS SPONSORED
  - CDUS Coded Values
    - 1 Private Insurance
    - 2 Medicare
    - 3 Medicare and Private Insurance
    - 4 Medicaid
    - 5 Medicaid and Medicare
    - 6A Military Sponsored
    - 6B Veterans Sponsored
    - 7 Self Pay (no insurance)
    - 8 No means of payment (no insurance)
    - 98 Other
    - 99 Unknown

## Draft Policy Guiding Principles (from 6/1/2015)

- Minimal Necessary
  - Rationale: There should be a core set of elements that we think are universally important. We recognize the DCP approach - they identified a core set of elements that were important on all studies.
- Don't standardize codes unless necessary
  - Rationale: Depending on the application, the codes can be mapped downstream. There will be no universally acceptable set of codes that will avoid the need for re-mapping, so harmonizing codes may not be the highest priority.
- Don't change data elements unless necessary
  - Rationale: Changes will have impact (and associated cost) on existing systems if there are changes that do not justify the associated cost
- Keep it simple
  - Rationale: makes sense
- Start small
  - Rationale: We can test the impact of the most important changes before expanding.
