Meeting Recap

- Reviewed the analysis from the integrations matrix
 - Discussed starting with the 45 enumerated CDEs first and determine how to code those
- Identified a list of issues with the existing CDEs
 - All caps for the value meanings
 - Ampersand
 - Use of the work "for"
 - Abbreviations
 - Value meanings are simplified versions of the actual meanings
- Discussed using shortened values rather than number codes to avoid error
- Agreed to create a style sheet to better format the forms
 - This style sheet will be used prospectively for everyday curation moving forward
- Sent out a poll to vote on which set content we will start with first: caAERS or OPEN Demography

Polling Results

- 5 organizations voted for caAERS
- 2 organizations voted for OPEN Demography

Majority consensus to start with the caAERS data

 OPEN demography will be slotted for the 2nd Phase of the NRDS Project

NRDS Content Strategy

- 1. Review and prioritize the 23 caAERS forms to determine what ones we want to start with first
- 2. Define a set of recommendations
 - 1. Review the PVs
 - 2. Coded Values
 - 3. Formatting
- 3. Curator will provide examples with the implemented recommendations for the group to review for each form
- 4. Send the list of recommendations and the standardized form(s) to the NRDS Committee to review and approve.

- 1. Style guide for formatting the caAERS CRFs.
 - · COG has sent existing style guides we can use as a starting point
 - The style guide will be used moving forward for curation efforts
- 2. Mocked up version of the 23 caAERS forms with implemented recommendations

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Curation Style Guide

Common Issues for Question and Values

- Symbols !@#\$%^&*()<>/\{}[]
- Abbreviations and Acronyms
 - Diagnoses; Anatomical Sites; Disease Status; Institutions...
- Subscript and Superscript
- Units of Measure
 - In question text
- Capitalization
- Using NCI Standards
 - When is it OK to stray from the standards?
- Use of Integers: 1 or one
- Patient/Person/Participant

Question Text (1)

Stand Alone Questions

- *If patient has been diagnosed with melanoma and is male,* has patient agreed to use contraception for the duration of the study?
- Time Points
 - Embedded time points in the question text
- Multiple Conditions/Compound Questions
 - Does patient have A or B or C if not previously treated?
- Verb Tense (Past/Present/Future)
- Subject Verb Agreement (Singular vs Plural)

Question Text (2)

- Questions versus Statements Punctuation
 - ?
 - ____
- Capitalization
 - Mixed
 - All Caps
 - First letter of every word
- Use of "the"
 - "Did patient" versus "Did the patient"

Value Domains (1)

- Embedding Separate Questions in Value Domains
 - Were lung nodules biopsied? Yes/No; Was tumor found in the biopsy specimen? Yes/No; Were lung nodules biopsied? No/Yes, tumor found in the biopsy specimen/Yes, tumor not found in the biopsy specimen
- Indicator Value Domains
 - Use established and preferred Indicator value domains
- Complete Enumerated Value Domains
 - Standard lists (curate entire list)
- Missing Concepts for Permissible Values

Value Domains

- Use of "Other Specify"
- Use of "N/A"
- Capitalization of PVs and PV Meanings
- Use of Symbols in PVs and PV Meanings
- Abbreviations and Acronyms in PVs and PV Meanings
- Duplicative information
 - PV: Upper Respiratory Tract (URT)
- Use of "/" in PVs
 - Liver/Spleen
- Length of PVs and VMs
